- 1 Lundin-CHUV Open Access Brain Tumour Database with a Research Support Unit
 - Aims to be the largest and most comprehensive open access brain tumour database
 - Over 500 Glioblastoma tissue samples already available
 - Includes all types of brain tumours
 - Only database to collect clinical, omics, radiomics and neuropathological data
 - Designed to be accessible to researchers from all over the world

- 2 The Lundin-CHUV Grant program
 - Supporting 5 key innovative clinical trials
 - Projects linked to the Lundin Database
 - Aims to promote internal, national & international collaborations
- 3 The Lundin-CHUV Fellowship in Neuro-Oncology Program
 - Provides cutting-edge training in clinics and research for physicians interested in neuro-oncology
 - Develops a network of the very best specialists in this field to provide a new level of care and treatment
